The following is how to connect with others through ZOOM even if you don't have a computer, tablet or smart phone:

1. First in order to connect you need to have an invitation. If you are part of a committee/team you should automatically receive an email invite to your next meeting. If you are wanting to join the coffee hour after worship or participate in the virtual Adult Sunday School at 10:15, go to the link for this is <https://zoom.us/j/730238634> or join by phone, 1 312 626 6799.
2. If you are coming in via computer, tablet or smart phone, simply click on the link in your email, or copy and paste the link to your browser. If you do not have a computer, tablet or smart phone, simply call the phone number. A voice will prompt you to key in the meeting ID number followed by the pound key, that your contact person gave you. The voice may ask you to enter a pin number followed by the pound key, if you were not given a pin number simply press pound.
3. For those who come in via computer, tablet or smart phone, and this is your first time on ZOOM you will need to download the software as the site prompts you. Once it downloads the needed software will give you the option to open ZOOM launcher or RUN, depending on your device. It will ask you if you want to use the audio using your device, hit yes. NOTE: Some computers such as desktops do not have access to audio; all you have to do is choose the phone option instead. It will give you the meeting code and pin number.

We are advised to exercise social distancing, social distancing does NOT have to happen in total isolation. Let us find new ways of staying connected.



“Now that I have gotten my first dose of the vaccine, many, including myself, are anxious to open our doors to worshipping together physically. We’ve spent almost a year at this point, measuring how much we have lost, but in this time of Lent, I hope you will see how much we have gained. I think the most important thing I have gained is a new perspective.

Funny. Some years ago, the United Methodist denomination, came up with a new movement called rethink church, asking the question, “What does it mean to be the church?” T-shirts were distributed that read, “Church Can Happen Anywhere.” Some of us, like myself, thought it was a cute saying, but were too busy focusing on the week-to-week responsibilities of maintaining the status quo, to look at the implications that statement makes.

And then March 15, 2020 happened. Looking back at the days leading up to that day it felt like the world was shutting down. In a matter of days, even our church (as we knew it) was closing... at least that’s how it felt at the time. The reality is we continued to be the core of what the church is, people doing God’s work in the world. We discovered the building on third street, we affectionately called church, was really a tool we use for ministry. Even though the worship services were no longer happening in the building, we continued to use the building to minister to the broader community.

Yes, we continued to rent part of the building to Kid’s Korner (a for profit child-care business) at a lower rate than they would find elsewhere. This allows the owner, Sabrina Benish, to keep her costs down, so she can pass the savings on to families who struggle financially. Although our office hours were reduced, the church was

considered essential due to the Good Samaritan program which offers gas cards for the financially challenged, so people could make job interviews and doctor appointments. Of course, we continued to collect food for the local food pantry and we still collected Christmas gifts for the Helping Hands ministry, both outside the building. The church building was also used for two blood drives. Not bad for being “closed”.

By March 22 we discovered that church really CAN happen anywhere. We went from two

worship services, each limited to what our sanctuary and parlor could hold on Saturdays (4:30) and Sundays (9:00), to two worship services simultaneously available on two video platforms with unlimited seating; Facebook and YouTube. Despite this expanded opportunity, some didn’t have access to services, so we sent out worship manuscripts, and even started airing worship services on Reedsburg TV channel 11.1.

Perhaps all of us are looking forward to getting back together face to face once again, I know I am. But my new perspective is not only that the church is not a building, it is also not a worship service. As corny as it sounds, we are the church. We are Jesus’ hands, feet, and mouthpiece to help build God’s kingdom. When we return to worshipping live and in person, we would be doing God’s kingdom a great disservice if we were to just go back to business as usual.

We need to identify where the church is going to show up in the Reedsburg community. We need to expand our use of the building to meet the needs of the community the other five days of the week. We need to birth new forms of outreach to demonstrate our love of neighbor, by doing what Jesus did; meeting people where they are at. We need to do this, not for the purpose of filling our pews back up, and no, it’s not even so we can feel good about what we are doing. We need to do this, so we are making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

- We continue to offer “Coffee Hour” after the Facebook Premier is finished airing. You may attend through the video platform ZOOM by clicking on the link <https://zoom.us/j/730238634>. If you want to just phone in, the number is 1 312 626 6799. The Adult Bible Study meets on the same link at 10:15.
- March 7, will be our next drive-thru communion, between 9:45 and 10:00 am. We will continue offering this on the first Sunday of each month, until we are able to resume in person worship services.
- Pick up your Holy Week bags at the church on 833 3rd Street drive-thru on Sunday March 21 9:45-10:15 OR March 27, 3-4 pm OR stop in the office call anytime between 9:00 am March 22 and 11:30 am March 25 to pick up or make other arrangements.
- Lenten services continue to be available on Wednesdays, March 3-24, at 3:30 on Reedsburg station 11.1 AND 6:30 pm CT on Facebook (<https://www.facebook.com/reedsburgumc/>) with a live host/ess to greet you, YouTube (https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCm55c9m0Q6Uf_F1QKhMMGDw) is also available any time after 6:30 pm.
- If you would like to meet with Pastor Vicki one on one, you may make an appointment to meet at the church. However, if you are still wishing to stay home, she will be available for one on one via Zoom, Skype, Facebook Messenger or good old fashion telephone. Please limit contact with her on Fridays to emergencies, as that is her day off.
- We continue to receive non-perishable food donations in the plastic bins located just to the right of the 3rd Street entrance to the church. With the colder weather please ensure it is only items that can withstand cold temperatures, without expanding.
- Viking Village Foods offers the church a rebate for any receipts turned in to their store. If you shop at Viking Village you are encouraged to drop your receipt at the donation box located at the 3rd Street entrance of the church at any time. When we do resume live worship services, they can also be deposited in the offering baskets.
- Another simple way of contributing to the church is through the Smiles program on Amazon. Simply log in to smile.amazon.com and choose Reedsburg United Methodist Church. Then whenever you shop amazon make sure your shopping is done through Amazon Smile, and a portion of the retail will be sent to RUMC.
- Other ways of giving is mailing or dropping off your financial gifts to 833 3rd Street, Reedsburg, Wisconsin 53959. You may also go to our website, reedsburgunitedmethodistchurch.org and click on the donate button, or you may text your gift at 855-963-3691.
- If you or anyone in the community has a prayer need—and who doesn’t?—RUMC is there for you. We are lining up prayer angels, people who are passionate about prayer, to check that email daily, praying and responding. Unless you are on one of the prescription teams,
you may have forgotten.

On Oct 27th, 2019 the RUMC congregation voted to accept the MCCI “Prescriptions.” Those who stepped up to serve on a team have been carrying on through 2020 despite the difficulties of the pandemic. Experienced coaches, as promised, have continued to provide support for the prescription teams.

Prescription #1 Develop a strong discipleship pathway so that all church members can grow and mature spiritually. . .

Prescription #2 Cultivate skills for inviting and engaging more and more of the church family to serve, rise up, and contribute their passions and talents in mission and ministry . . .

Prescription #3 Assure, any time newcomers are on the church property, every person experiences the love of the congregation. . .

Prescription #4 Confirm that all those in attendance have the opportunity to experience God’s presence. . .

Prescription #5 . . .engage teams that will be privileged to love, serve, and pray for our neighbors, as part of its congregation who just are not inside our church walls yet!

Our 833 Breakthrough Prayer, the foundation of the MCCI, asks for a connection with God “*leading us to a breakthrough year of growth and service beyond our dreams and expectations.*” *It is our hope that you have witnessed, in some way, the results of this prayer. We have had many unique opportunities to serve and be served during 2020. The MCCI teams are just an example, as are the new Servant Leadership Board, and our staff who have adapted to our needs. Pastor Vicki and those who have helped to create meaningful, engaging, RUM Worship at Home Editions, week after week, have been serving and reaching out beyond our RUMC family. This is evidenced by those, from across the country, that contribute to the worship chat. You may have made and received phone calls, yard visits, gift bags, or joined a gathering on the church patio. The newsletter, biweekly emails, website, and Facebook page are further attempts to keep us connected and informed. RUMC servants are behind all this outreach.*

As we look forward to vaccines, spring, and warmer days, we will again have the opportunity to get together on our church patio. This space along with an updated and welcoming 4th street entrance, created by a servant team last summer. The patio provides a place to gather outside. Bishop Jung’s Prayer Request

“Let us learn from Jesus and his earliest followers. They met with each other in small gatherings. They prayed without ceasing for one another. And no buildings called the churches existed. The only thing they had in common was their decision to follow Jesus. Through the holy spirit, they had a beautiful relationship.”

Bishop Jung shared this sorely needed instruction during his September 6th, 2020 sermon. His final words *“I do not know what form the beloved community of followers of Jesus will take in the future. I pray Jesus will give us insight in these times of transition. There is one thing I know that will continue to bind us together, that is prayer. Nothing in this changing time prevents us from supporting each other in prayer. Prayer was at the core of the earliest community of those who followed Jesus.”*

Bishop Jung asked us all to lift up everyone in prayers daily and, *“if we are aware of a current need, name it, but otherwise, to say the name and ask for God’s blessings. The power of the Holy Spirit is at work in us. The healing and blessings will follow from our being, our words, and our doing, into the life of those around us.”* Bishop Jung concluded by reminding us *“we are called to be hope in times of trial, temptation, and tragedy. When we are weak, we will be made strong.”* *We are the church together. We are a church that prays! Not only at 8:33 but unceasingly.*

*Be happy in your hope, stand your ground when you’re in trouble,
and devote yourselves to prayer. Romans 12:12*
